DRIVING TOUR

Building names are **bold** with the corresponding alphanumeric codes from the campus map; departments and offices of academic interest are underlined.

- To begin, please observe the buildings surrounding the visitor's parking lot.
 - **Westside Hall (WE)** was recently renovated in 2004 and is home to many student services, including: the Abron's Student Health Center, the UNCW Pharmacy, the Counseling Center, University College, International Programs, and University Learning Services (tutoring and peer editing).
 - **King Hall (KI)** (located just beyond Westside Hall) is home to the Department of Film Studies, the Office of Financial Aid and Veterans' Services, Student Accounts and Cashiers Services.
 - **Kenan Hall (KE)** is currently under renovation and will reopen within the next year.
 - **Alderman Hall (AL)** is the main administrative building of UNCW, housing Chancellor Rosemary DePaolo, the Vice Chancellors, the Dean of Students, the Provost, and other academic administrators. *Alderman Hall* is also one of the three original buildings opened in 1961 at this location and served as the backdrop for "Capeside High School" during the years of the WB's *Dawson's Creek*.
 - **Hoggard Hall (HO)** is home to various offices of official university business and the Information Technology Systems Division. This building is also one of the three original structures on the South College Road campus.
- Next, exit visitors parking, turning **RIGHT** onto **WAGONER DRIVE**.
 - The first building you will see on the right is **Randall Library (RL)**, home to over 500,000 volumes as well as the offices for the Honors Scholars Program, Institutional Diversity, Center for Teaching Excellence, Java City and the Center for the Support of Undergraduate Research and Fellowships. Students may also receive books from locations around the world through Interlibrary Loan.
 - Shortly after, you will notice **Kenan Auditorium (KA)**, UNCW's main theatrical and performance venue. Guest speakers, performers, and student productions are held throughout the year in this 1,000 seat auditorium.
- When you reach the stop sign, turn **RIGHT** onto **RANDALL DRIVE**.
 - To your right, you will notice **DeLoach Hall (DL)**, which houses the Departments of Geology & Geography, Physics & Physical Oceanography, and Pre-Engineering.
 - Next, you will see **Bear Hall (BR)**, home to the Departments of Mathematics & Statistics and Philosophy & Religion; the dean's office of the College of Arts & Sciences is also located on the first floor.
 - As you approach the water tower, you will notice a colonnade that resembled the UNCW logo; this is the official gateway to our campus commons.
 - To the right of the colonnade is **Morton Hall (MO)**, which houses the Departments of English, Creative Writing, and History, as well as Bryan Auditorium, one of the largest lecture facilities on campus, seating 200 people.
 - To the left of the colonnade is **Leutze Hall (LH)**, which houses the Departments of Communication Studies, Foreign Languages & Literatures, Public and International Affairs (Political Science), and Social Work. Leutze (pronounced Loot-zee) is named in honor of former UNCW Chancellor James R. Leutze, and also is home to UNCW-TV.
 - As you cross the intersection with the traffic light, you will notice **Friday Hall (FR)** which is under renovation. When it reopens later this year, it will house the Department of Environmental Studies and the Gerontology component of the Department of Health & Applied Human Sciences.
- When the road dead ends, follow the curve to the **RIGHT** onto **REYNOLDS DRIVE**.
 - As you round the corner, you will see the **Cultural Arts Building (CA)**, which is home to the Departments of Art & Art History, Music, and Theatre, as well as an art gallery, a Broadway-style theatre (*Mainstage Theater*), a Standing Room Only (SRO) theater, and a music recital hall.
 - Next you will see the **Education Building (EB)**, home of the Donald R. Watson School of Education. Students can receive degrees in four areas with secondary licensure in 16 disciplines.
 - As you cross **CAHILL DRIVE**, make note of the modular buildings to your left. The modular units temporarily house the contents of Friday Hall. The space just before the modular units is the future home of UNCW's new 35 million dollar School of Nursing Building, which should open in early 2009, housing the School of Nursing.
 - As you cross the double sidewalk, you will see **Wagoner Dining Hall (WA)** to your left. Though one of ten dining locations on the campus, this is both the largest and also the only location setup as a cafeteria.

- When you reach the stop sign, the building to your left is the **Student Recreation Center (SRC)**.
- Turn **RIGHT** onto **PRICE DRIVE**.
 - The first building to your right is **Dobo Hall (DO)**, which houses the Departments of Biology & Marine Biology and Chemistry and Biochemistry.
 - The building adjacent to Dobo Hall is **Cameron Hall (CH)**, which houses the dean's office of the Cameron School of Business Administration, as well as its Departments of Accountancy & Business Law, Economics & Finance, Management, and Marketing.
 - As you begin to round the curve, you will see the **Social & Behavioral Sciences Building (SB)**, which houses the Departments of Anthropology, Psychology, and Sociology & Criminal Justice. This is the only building on campus (besides those recently opened) to not be named "Hall". This is because the last major donor's last name was Hall, and UNCW did not want to name the building "Hall Hall".
 - Next, you will see the new **Computer Information Systems Building (CI)**, which houses the Department of Computer Science from the College of Arts & Sciences and the Department of Information Systems & Operations Management from the Cameron School of Business.
 - As you continue, you will see the **Fisher University Union (FUU)** to your right. Inside, you will find the Center for Leadership Education and Service, Campus Life, the Upperman African-American Cultural Center, Centro Hispano, Transition Programs, the Career Center, UNCW Presents, and Student Media. You will also find the Hawk's Nest (a mall food court style eatery), Main Street Express (a convenience store), On The Rocks (marble slab creamery), Seahawk Mail, the UNCW Transportation Store, Ditto's: The Copy Spot, the UNCW Technology Store, and meeting rooms.
 - Next door to the University Union is the **Burney Center (BU)**. This building features three ballrooms for use during dinners, concerts, and other special events.
- When you reach the stop sign, turn **RIGHT** onto **RIEGEL ROAD**.
 - The fields to your left are UNCW's outdoor athletic complexes and the Intramural Fields.
 - To your right, you will notice **UNION DRIVE**. At the end of this road is the **Fisher Student Center (FSC)**, which houses the Campus Activities & Involvement Center, Lumina Theatre (the largest theatre operating in Wilmington), numerous meeting spaces, and the UNCW Bookstore.
 - Next, you will see the **Warwick Center (WC)** to your right. This building is under renovation.
- At the stop sign, turn **LEFT** onto **HAMILTON DRIVE**.
 - The building to your left is **Hanover Hall (HA)**, home to the Student-Athlete Seahawk Strength Center and the women's volleyball team.
 - Connected to Hanover Hall is a two-story structure called the **Natatorium (NA)**, home to UNCW's swimming and diving programs.
 - Next, is the **Alkust-Nixon Sports Medicine Building (SM)**, which has classroom space, strength and conditioning facilities for our student-athletes, and the coach's offices of the majority of UNCW's outdoor sports.
- At the stop light, turn **RIGHT** onto **HURST DRIVE**. Then make your **SECOND RIGHT** onto **WAGONER DRIVE**.
 - The large building to your right is **Trask Coliseum (TR)**, which houses the Department of Health & Applied Human Sciences, as well UNCW's basketball programs.
 - The next building is **James Hall (JA)**, which houses the offices of the Registrar and Admissions, as well as the Graduate School.
- After going through the traffic circle, you may turn into the parking lot next to Alderman Hall and return to the visitors parking lot to begin the University Housing Driving Tour, or depart campus accordingly. Thank you for visiting the campus of the University of North Carolina Wilmington!
