Please do not submit any artwork, photographs, film or music samples with your application. Decisions will not be based on supplemental materials as the Admission Committee is not formally trained to evaluate them. Any supplemental items will not be returned to the applicant.

# Transfer Admission Requirements

We will consider your application as a transfer student if:

- You are eligible to return to the last institution you attended,
- You attained at least a 2.5 cumulative GPA on a 4.0 scale on all transferable work attempted (the Office of Admissions may recompute your GPA to include all institutions attended),
- You completed at least 24 semester hours or 36 quarter hours of transferable credit (preference is shown to transfer applicants with the highest number of transferable hours), and
- Of those 24 semester hours (or 36 quarter hours), you have at least 6 transferable semester hours (9 quarter hours) of freshman English and at least 3 transferable semester hours (5 quarter hours) of college-level mathematics.

## We will also consider:

1. The individual grades received in courses and the academic rigor of courses completed.
2. Declared major and courses completed toward that major.
3. Essay, extracurricular activities and work experience.

If you are a transfer student who is under 24 years of age and did not complete the minimum high school course requirements or who earned a GED, you may apply to transfer after completing a minimum of 30 semester hours with a cumulative 2.5 on a 4.0 scale in the following college courses:

- 6 semester hours (9 quarter hours) of freshman composition
- 6 semester hours (9 quarter hours) of college-level mathematics
- 6 semester hours (9 quarter hours) of science
- 6 semester hours (9 quarter hours) of social science
- 6 semester hours (9 quarter hours) of foreign language

UNC Wilmington may waive the minimum high school requirements if you are at least 24 years of age.

After March 1, we will process applications on a space-available basis only. The university reserves the right to return an application and fee if received after March 1.



## Spring Semester

Admission for the spring term is extremely limited. The Office of Admissions will announce by September 21 if applications will be accepted and considered for the spring semester. The university does not encourage transfer students to plan on spring enrollment. If space is available, it will be limited to those students who have earned an associate of arts or science degree or at least 54 transferable credits from an accredited college or university with a 3.0 or better cumulative grade point average. ## Transfer of Credit

You may earn up to 64 semester hours (93 quarter hours) of credit from an accredited two-year college toward graduation from UNC Wilmington or 93 semester hours (139 quarter hours) of credit from an accredited four-year college toward graduation from UNC Wilmington. The university will include online courses, advanced placement credit, CLEP credit and military service credit (Army/ACE Registry or SMART transcript) in these totals. If you are admitted, the registrar will automatically evaluate your transfer credit. ## Enrollment Deposit

Admitted candidates have until December 1 (for spring semester) and May 1 or 30 days from the date of the admission letter (for fall semester) to submit an enrollment deposit. The university reserves the right to decline admission if you do not submit an enrollment deposit by the designated deadline.

## Transfer Application Instruction Checklist

- Application/Fee** – Include a non-refundable application fee of \$60. Make your check or money order payable to UNC Wilmington, and mail it with your application. The payment must clearly indicate the applicant's full name and date of birth.
- Transcripts** – Have all official transcripts from all colleges/universities you have attended sent directly to the Office of Admissions. Have an official high school transcript or GED scores sent directly to the Office of Admissions.
- Courses in Progress** – If currently enrolled in college, please provide a copy of your registration for classes in progress. Failure to provide a current course registration may delay the review of your application. Note: be sure to submit your final transcript with grades of all courses completed.
- Essay** – Please respond to the essay question provided in the application. This is a required application item.
- Military Credit** – If you desire credit for past military experience, you must provide the Army/ACE Registry or SMART transcript for evaluation. If admitted, waiver of the university physical education requirement cannot be granted without one of these documents on file in your application records.
- Residency Application** – If you are a North Carolina resident, please complete the residency application which is required to qualify for the in-state tuition rate. This form is enclosed with the application.
- Citizenship** – If you are not a U.S. citizen, enclose a copy of your I-551/Alien Registration Card (Green Card) or visa.
