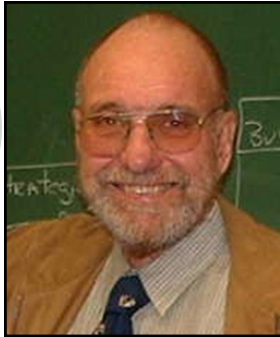

The Pedagogy and Theory Relevant for 21st Century Learning

Dr. Cambourne is Principal Fellow in the Faculty of Education at University of Wollongong, Australia. He began teaching in 1956 when he was 19 years old, and spent 15 years teaching in a mix of one-room schools, and primary and elementary classrooms (K-6) for the New South Wales Department of Education. He completed his Ph.D. at James Cook University in northern Queensland, Australia, and was subsequently a Fulbright Scholar and a Post-Doctoral Fellow at Harvard University. He has been a Visiting Fellow at the University of Illinois in the Center for the Study of Reading and the University of Arizona.

Since 1980, Cambourne has been researching how learning occurs. He is best known for his Conditions of Learning. In this forum, Brian Cambourne will argue that at the core of the on-going debates about the pedagogy of literacy in particular and pedagogy in general, is a set of issues centered on how we have traditionally conceptualized “learning.”
